



Electrical Permits

When is an Electrical Permit Required?

- An electrical permit is required:
 - For every new electrical installation in any construction, remodeling, replacement, or repair.
 - When electrical equipment is removed and reinstalled such as with the installation of a new exterior finish (siding).
 - When a furnace, boiler, air conditioner, electric water heater or any device that is hardwired into the electrical system is replaced.
 - When an electrical device that requires hardwired line voltage is installed such as a gas fireplace.
- An electrical permit is not required for minor repair work such as replacing a defective receptacle outlet.
- The individual performing the work is required to be licensed.
 - Exception: Homeowners that will personally and physically perform the electrical work on the single family detached dwelling that they own and occupy are not required to hold an electrical license. However, a valid permit shall be on file with the State Electrical Inspector before the commencement of the electrical work.
- Inspections must be scheduled by the individual performing the work.
- The final electrical inspection should be completed and signed off by the Electrical Inspector prior to scheduling the required building, mechanical or plumbing final inspection.
- The Building Inspection Record Card (green card), issued by the City of Mendota Heights, must be on site for all inspections, including the electrical inspection(s).
